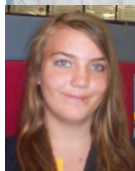

WAP students have made a great start in CaFS. It was fantastic to meet Year 11 students at Access Camp and cover important concepts including Maslow's Hierarchy of Needs.

Year 11 students are working on the topic 'Resource Management' dealing with concepts such as values, standards, goals and needs. Their first assessment requires the students to interview a HSC student to gather data about workload management, followed by writing an extended response about maintaining a positive well-being.

HSC students are studying the topic 'Groups in Context' looking at groups such as the Aged, Sole Parents, Homeless and Socioeconomically Disadvantaged.
