Our PBL focus areas for Weeks 1-5 are :

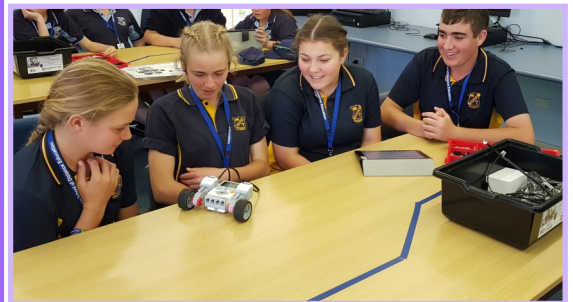
- **Consider others before you speak**

Examination Procedures

For all examinations students must:

- Be on time for all examinations
- Attend every examination and make a serious attempt
- Follow the supervisors' instructions
- Be prepared with the equipment required:

- Black pens
- Pencils, erasers and a sharpener (use pencils where specifically directed)
- A ruler marked in millimetres and centimetres
- Highlighter pens
- NESA approved calculators where necessary

- Not share equipment during the examination
- Not bring mobile phones, smart watches etc. into the examination room
- Line up outside the examination room, leaving bags outside
- Bring a book/magazine to read once the examination has finished

Students are expected to be prepared for and attend normal classes when not in an examination

During examination period students may:

- Submit an "Assessment Appeal Form" (if necessary), with a Doctor Certificate if you are sick on the day and notify the school immediately of your absence
- Take in a bottle of water
- It is essential that students do not attempt to communicate with other students during examinations, as this may provide students with an unfair advantage and disrupt other students during the examination. In this instance, students will receive zero marks and a letter will be sent home.

Be Bus Aware

Bus Safety Week 6-12 November 2017



About

NSW Bus Safety Week will be held from **6–12 November 2017** to highlight the importance of bus-related safety issues for all road users.

Bus Safety Week is organised by Transport for NSW as part of the 'Be Bus Aware' campaign which aims to reinforce the road rules relating to buses to the community and promote safer on-road interactions between pedestrians, motorists, bicycle riders and buses.

The issue

- NSW has one of the largest metropolitan bus fleets in Australia.
- Every day in NSW, hundreds of thousands of school children, workers and tourists use buses to get around and travel all or part of their journey to school and work or to explore our state.
- In the five years to 2016, 20 people lost their lives in bus-related crashes, while 1,335 people were injured across the Sydney-Newcastle-Wollongong area. Of these 20 fatalities, 12 were pedestrians, 4 were drivers of other vehicles, 2 were cyclists, 1 was the passenger of another vehicle, and 1 was a motorcyclist.
- Crashes involving buses often result in more severe outcomes to other road users due to their size and mass, and because due to their size and weight, they take more time to stop.

Get involved

Working with our partners and the community, we aim to help people Be Bus Aware.

We have produced a Partner Toolkit to support you in promoting Bus Safety Week in your communities. The toolkit consists of posters, website tiles and Facebook cover pics (see over the page).
