Year 10 Visual Arts

This semester in Visual Arts students have worked on producing an appropriated artwork and a mixed media artwork.

Appropriation in art is the use of a pre-existing object or images with little or no transformation. The use of appropriation in art has played a significant role in the history of arts. Students chose to explore an artist and a particular artwork from that artist as a source of inspiration. Hannah Taylor and Tallia Scanlan appropriated an artwork by Frida Kahlo. Lochlan Cameron, Willa Stokes and Zachariah Millstead appropriated an artwork by Salvador Dali.

At the end of Term 3 and beginning of Term 4 students began working on the Mixed Media 'Mini-Body of Work'. Students had to build their own canvas and design their artwork around either a personal symbolic object or a universal symbolic object that they have a connection to the students on a personal level. Students created multiple drawings of their symbolic object and canvas design to generate ideas of ways it will be represented in their mixed media artwork. Students participated in a range of demonstrations to build on their knowledge of charcoal and soft pastel, oil pastel, water colours, acrylic and layering.




