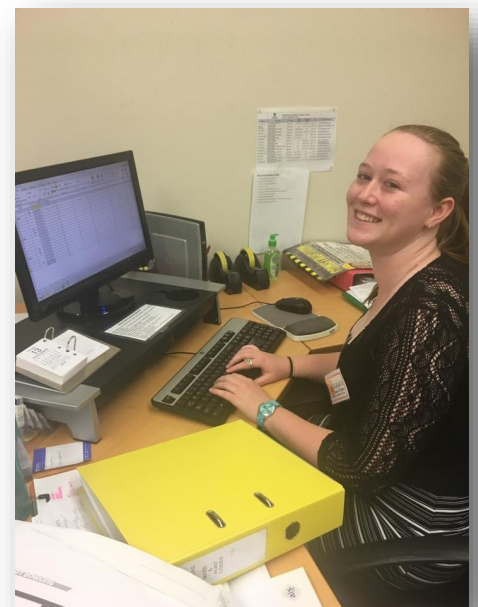
Work Placement

If your child/children are getting off the bus at a different stop, please notify the bus driver of any changes.



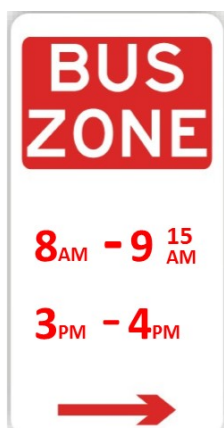
Bus Zone Parking
