### NAIDOC Day 2020 - Always Was, Always Will Be

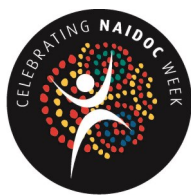
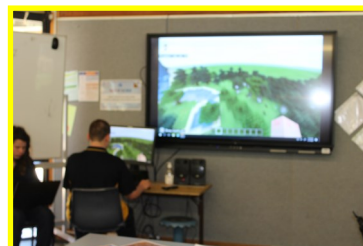
NAIDOC Day celebrates the achievements and culture of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.

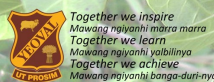
