The reason for this was so that we could honour two of our past principals, who both died in the Second World War. In an acknowledgement to the RAAF and its 100 year anniversary, it was fitting that both these men were in the RAAF.

The school was delighted that Mr Alf Cantrell joined us as our expert on Flying officer James Alexander Saint-Smith and Sergeant Darius Bede Northmore. He presented our formal address and spoke of the exploits of both men, highlighting the impact of their deaths on their students who purchased plagues in

their honour and planted a tree. These plagues are now located on our learning centre entrance way and we will also plant two trees in memory of both men.

School COVID Vaccination requirements from 8th November 2021

From 8th November all department employees, EAT&GO volunteers, HSC supervision staff, contractors, visitors and students on professional experience placements are required to be fully vaccinated or hold a valid medical contraindication certificate in accordance with the Public Health Order, issued on 23 September 2021.

Under the current Level 3 restrictions parents are still unable to attend the school, other than for drop off & pick of students or if attending a scheduled meeting with a member of staff.


