FYI PROJECT 4

"How can our knowledge of past civilisations help us to live a balanced life today?" was the driving question that students worked towards answering through their learning during Project 4.

As a class, students learnt about Indigenous history with a focus on the local Wiradjuri people. During this learning, an emphasis was placed on the development of historical investigative skills, such as research, an understanding of both primary and secondary information sources, evaluation of those sources and communication of relevant information to a specific audience.

The ultimate goal of the project was the growth in

their empathy and respect towards the culture and histories of the First Australians.

The movie, "Night at the Museum", provided students with an opportunity to compare and contrast the portrayal of historical figures in popular culture to their depiction in historically accurate sources of information.

Collaboratively, students investigated a past civilisation to create a poster board demonstrating their knowledge of the civilisation. Students were required to highlight the contribution that these past civilisations have made to enhancing and influencing present day society. *Mr Ken Horley*


Homework Hub
