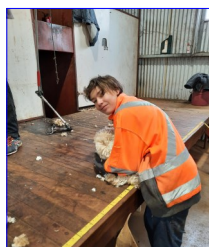
WORK EXPERIENCE - YEAR 9/10

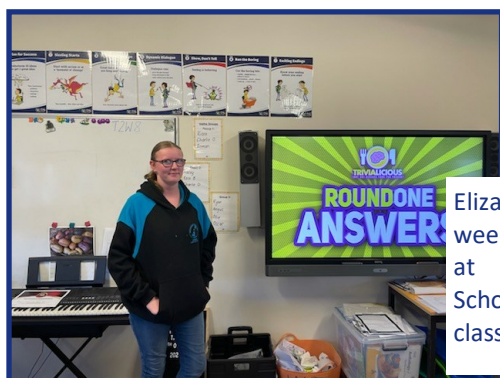
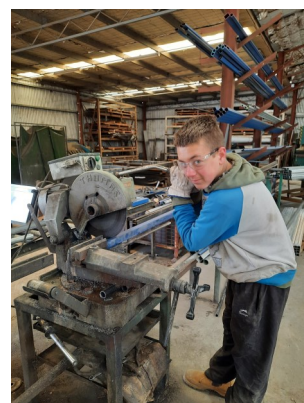
In the week of work experience on the farm, I worked with sheep and did some work with an old harvester. The first couple of days we rounded up sheep, fed and then weighed them. We were going to work with the sheep more but the weather changed our plans. While it was raining, we worked in the shed fixing old equipment and afterwards worked with the harvester fixing the electronics in it. In between the spots of rain, I chased mice and removed Bathurst Burrs from the paddocks. *Ezra*

I worked as a farmhand at Goodrich. Because of the weather, it was a slow week. It was fairly cold the first couple of days so we did some fencing and some rock picking. It was quite a fun experience. I never found myself bored with nothing to do. There was always a job to do. The last couple of days were wet. We couldn't go anywhere because we would get bogged so we did some work in the shed cleaning and fixing old machinery. On the last day it was mostly cloudy. We could have got out of the shed but the river was up so we had to stay put and kept working on the header. Things that I didn't enjoy was the rain. I felt it held me back from doing some work. *Johnathon*

I did my work experience at the local land service. On the first day I went down to the Dubbo saleyards to check that every sheep, lamb and ram had an ear tag and was fit to travel on top of a vehicle. The second day I headed out to a fox baiting group to inform farmers of how to appropriately use 1080 fox poison and hand it out along with the necessary paper work. Unfortunately, the final three days were interrupted by bad weather in the form of rain. *Cooper*

I worked with Year 3/4 at Yeoval Central School. I got to work with a lot of the students and do one on one teaching with them. I saw the uniqueness in everyone, and how they learn. I also had the opportunity to teach the kindergarten students. On one of the days there wasn't a lot of students at school and it was great how the teacher could improvise her program to suit each student. Overall, it was a good it experience and an eye opener. *Erin*

I worked at Kerin Engineering and during the week I made a windmill. On Monday I learned how to properly use an angle grinder and did some welding for the first time. On Tuesday I started making my windmill with a round disc that I then used a plasma cutter to cut down some metal pieces . I made a base for it and finished it. On Wednesday and Thursday I cut material to make a tray for the back of a ute for someone. On Friday I helped flip some feeders, brushed down the welding spots then used a paint gun to spray over them so they were not visible. Unfortunately, one struggle for me that week was the angle grinding. I did a large amount of it and my hand started to hurt from the repetitive work. *Brad*
