- ☞ **Mindfulness activities, games and cupcake decorating.**

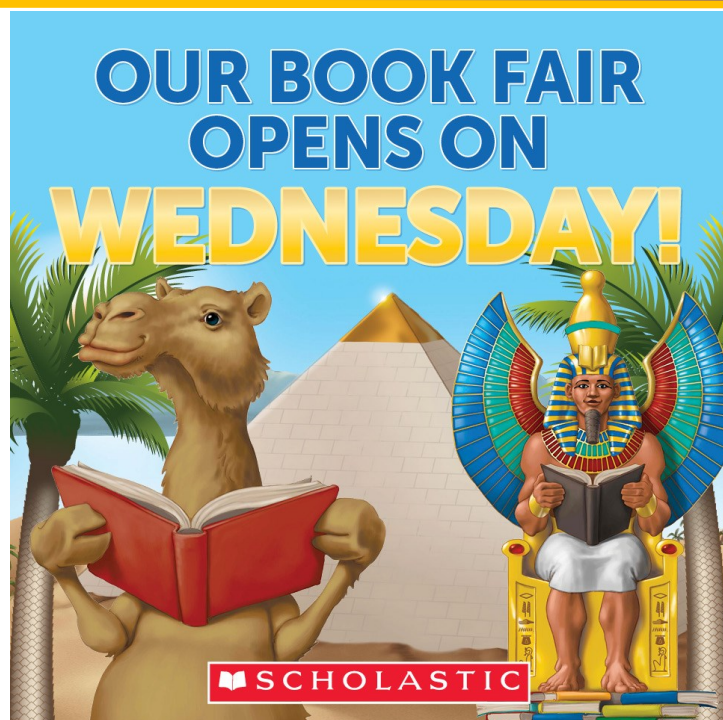
