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

State Drama Camp

From Sunday, June 20 to Wednesday, June 23 I attended the State Drama Camp at the Elanora Conference Centre in Sydney.

When arriving at the camp all 115 students were driven to the Capitol Theatre to see the musical "Come From Away". This musical is about an island off the coast of Canada that had 38 planes land during 911. The population of the island went from 9,000 to roughly 16,000 during 911.

Prior to arriving at the camp, every student had to list which workshops they would like to participate in on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. The workshops included voice, character, acting, improv, scriptwriting, and costume design as well as many more.

The students at the camp were also placed into 8 groups of 14-15 people. They had to work together in their groups to come up with a performance to show on Wednesday night in front of the other students.

On Monday night, Zeal Theatre performed for the camp an original script called MELTDOWN, and on Tuesday night two students that completed their HSC last year performed their HSC performances. All performances were outstanding and very well planned out.
