STAFF PROFILE: Mr Ken Horley

Mr Horley arrived at Yeoval Central School for a 10-week stint in Term 3, 2014. He ended up staying for the remainder of the year, and then the next year...and as they say, the rest is history!

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A STEP BACK IN TIME: Part 3

Yeoval Schooling in the early 1900s: Strange events!

Edward Morrison arrived at Yeoval Public School in 1900. He had become a pupil-teacher at the age of 14 in 1889 and completed a 4-year apprenticeship. But Morrison had only been in Yeoval for 2 months when the Department of Education received a petition signed by 11 parents asking to have him removed.

It was stated that Mr Morrison was living at the Hotel where he played cards and drank every night; he refused to mix with the local people and parents were considering removing their children from school.

When the Inspector of Schools contacted the petitioners, he discovered that not one of them had made a complaint! The petition was 'a downright forgery' and Mr Morrison was in fact 'a total abstainer from spirituous liquors.' He had however received two anonymous letters reflecting adversely on his character, and at that time they were common in the district.

But by early 1901, Mr Morrison had acquired more enemies when he stopped local residents from jumping the new fence and accessing the school tank water during a prolonged drought. In addition, in 1902 he was accused of stealing a 10 pound bank note and after being tried by a jury he was found not guilty. With a seriously 'diminished' reputation, Morrison was sent to a remote school on the far South Coast of NSW.

Students had a taste of what university is like, experiencing life as an undergraduate CSU student for the day. We arrived extremely excited at the University campus eager to get started. We were first greeted by our lovely campus staff and after some quick welcomes, got stuck into some fun introductory games!

After a short morning tea break, we had the opportunity to attend life-like university classes: a Social Work class and a Robotics class.

The **Social Work** class was held in one of the many tutorial classrooms and we participated in a variety of activities based around the Social Work Degree. Many were excited to learn about this industry, how social workers help others and the many people in our community who can benefit from social workers.

In the **Robotics** class, students were able to put their coding skills to good use. We had a lesson on Ozobots (a small programmable robot), creating colour coding tracks for the Ozobot to follow. Students learnt very quickly that different colours matched together made the Ozobot perform different tricks and enjoyed creating colour codes on different tracks together as a team. This session was a real hit for many of our students. Perhaps a few are interested in a career in STEM?

After lunch, students were excited to explore the University campus. We were given a full tour and discovered that although the CSU Dubbo Campus is one of their smaller sites, it has extensive facilities including a state-of-the-art library, classrooms, science laboratories, a fully equipped gym and games room, as well as tennis and basketball courts.
