


Students will be taking home their next supply of RAT tests this afternoon.



A STEP BACK IN TIME:Part 5

Prospects are very bright...A year after the 1914 school building was completed in Yeoval, enrolments reached 49. Two years later it was 75 and the school had a second teacher, but it was difficult for two teachers to work in an overcrowded classroom built for 50 students. The headmaster at the time, in applying for the building to be enlarged, argued that the prospects for the town were very bright with a Freezing Works nearing completion and the construction of the Molong-Dubbo Railway, via Yeoval, well underway. The decision was made to add a second classroom to the school building, while the question of a teacher's residence was reconsidered. Work on both buildings were completed by mid 1920, with a picket fence constructed around the teacher's residence.
