NAPLAN assessments are being conducted for students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 this week. Parents of students involved will have received an information letter home last week with detailed information.

A reminder of current COVID-19 close contact guidelines:

- You must notify the school if you/your child have been identified as a close contact and are intending to return to school.
- You/your child should conduct a daily rapid antigen test (RAT) and receive a negative result each morning before attending school for 5 subsequent school days as part of your personal responsibility to minimise the risk of transmission. Staff members and high school students must wear a mask indoors at all times except when eating or exercising. Primary school students are recommended to wear a mask indoors at all times (except when eating or exercising).
- No student or staff member identified as a close contact will be permitted to participate in overnight excursions, including school camps. *Trish Henderson, Principal*

<u>A STEP BACK IN TIME:Part 7</u>

Four-legged transport and the antics of boys...Many students attending Yeoval[•] Central School in the early 1900s travelled on foot, by horse or in a sulky. The 'horse yard' at the school was located near the Post Office. Some cheeky boys used to ask the teacher if they could go to the toilet, and they'd sneak down and open the gate and let the horses out. They would then spend the afternoon having to bring them all back!

On another occasion, one of the boys got hold of an old horse called 'Donk' for a bit of rodeo riding in the school yard. In the lower playground was a vacant block where town circuses were held. Buck jumping, boxing tents and Frank Gill's Rodeo performed here for public entertainment. Australia's singing cowboy Smoky Dawson also performed for Yeoval on this vacant block before it became part of the school grounds. In the 1920s, those who stayed on at school only went to sixth class, with two or three continuing to do the Intermediate Certificate by correspondence.
