The declaration of war in 1939 brought about the building by voluntary labour of an air raid shelter behind the school at Yeoval (now the location of the school gym).

A Mr Keith Neville recalls digging the shelter which was covered with tin and earth: "They went the full width of the school right up to the top fence and the teachers used to line the children up to see how quickly they could get in!"

With the end of the war, the shelter was filled in and a tennis court was built on the area in 1947 (later the court was removed and a netball court took its place which was sealed in 1968).





## STAGE 5 ARCHERY



During YCS sport, Stage 5 students had the opportunity to travel to Wambangalang and participate in a three-week Archery Program. Participation was excellent throughout the Program and a big thanks to Brooke's mum\_for her travel assistance in getting the students to and from Archery for the first two sessions.

During the third and final session, students participated in games around Archery Tag. This is a game where soft foam-tipped arrows are used in team versus team games. All the students quite enjoyed Miss Goulding joining in, as they had the opportunity to fire arrows not just at her but at each other! The student's enjoyment and maturity displayed in all three sessions was exemplary, and Miss Goulding looks forward to utilising Wambangalang in the future for more sport activities.
