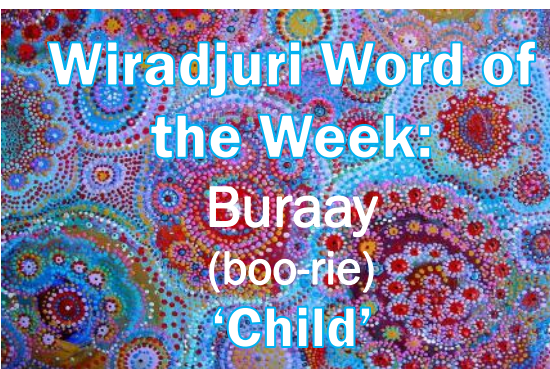

Last week we recognised **National Reconciliation Week** (NRW). Wiradjuri classes took part in special activities with Uncle Darren to reflect on the significance of this week. It has also been fantastic to hear H2O students talking about what they have been learning with Tim from Goanna Woodworks this term.

Respectful relationships across our whole school community are very important at YCS. (Student – student, staff – student, student – staff, parent – staff, staff – parent, parent – parent, everyone!). Respect is one of our three PBL values and I have certainly noticed that this is a strength across the school. I thank everyone for the role they play in this. In the classroom students are expected to speak politely, wear their uniform with pride, follow instructions first time, use positive body language, keep their hands to themselves, think before they act and respect others' right to learn.

Last week Years 10, 11, 12 students participated in the Love Bites Respectful Relationships Education Program. This program was arranged by Miss Goulding and consisted of two interactive workshops, creative workshops and community campaigns. I would encourage all secondary parents to discuss this program with their child.

I am looking forward to flying to Sydney with Lucy and Lillie on Wednesday to attend Government House. The Parliament of NSW and Government House jointly provide this civics and citizenship program for Year 12 captains and student leaders from all NSW secondary schools.

It gives the student leaders the opportunity to develop their knowledge of our system of government and parliamentary proceedings, and the opportunity to meet the Governor, Her Excellency The Honourable Margaret Beazley AO QC and gain a better understanding of her role. 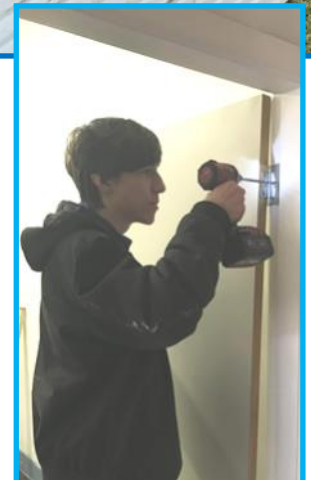

YCS—A STEP BACK IN TIME:Part 11

The declaration of war in 1939 brought about the building by voluntary labour of an air raid shelter behind the school at Yeoval (now the location of the school gym).

A Mr Keith Neville recalls digging the shelter which was covered with tin and earth: *“They went the full width of the school right up to the top fence and the teachers used to line the children up to see how quickly they could get in!”*

With the end of the war, the shelter was filled in and a tennis court was built on the area in 1947 (later the court was removed and a netball court took its place which was sealed in 1968).

STAGE 5 ARCHERY
