The didgeridoo, also known as the Yirdaki, is believed to be the world's oldest wind instrument—dating back thousands of years.

The instruments are made by from certain species of eucalypt after termites hollow them out—a process which usually takes a year. Harvesting must be timed so that the wall thickness is not too thick or too thin.
