Congratulations to all of our students who are in the midst of completing their HSC this year.

They have all worked hard and I look forward to seeing their results.

Two of our HSC students have submitted major works for 2022: Sam in Industrial Technology – Woodwork, and Lauren for Drama.

Assisted by Mr Hughes, Sam should be very proud of the tool caddy he planned and constructed this year which included developing a comprehensive portfolio.

Assisted by Mrs Johnson, Lauren's major work for HSC Drama was in two parts: an individual design project based on William Shakespeare's play 'Taming of the Shrew', creating costume designs for six main characters with a 1950's theme, and emphasising and challenging the stereotype of submissive women. She was also involved in a self-devised group performance called 'Back Roads'.

This script focused on the challenges of country living through the eyes of a city person, within a game show called 'Spin Your Disaster'. Throughout the process, Lauren explored concepts of play-building and experienced the challenges of group work.

These two projects were big undertakings for Sam and Lauren who continued to improve their practical skills and self confidence over the course of their projects.

They, and all our HSC students this year, should be very proud of their achievements.

Students in Kindergarten, Year 1 and Year 2 have completed a five-week intensive program, strengthening their mind-body connection to improve self-regulation. The children participated in activities to develop social and emotional skills, and sensory integration.

The sensory component was advised by the Occupational Therapist Emily, from Kerin Physio, who visits YCS every fortnight.
