# PRINCIPAL'S UPDATE



### **Gobondery/NARRAF Swimming Carnival - Narromine**

Students in Years 4-6 will also be competing in a swimming carnival at Narromine. The Gobondery/ NARRAF Swimming Carnival will be held on Friday 1 March, with students leaving at 8:00am and returning at 4:30pm by bus.

#### **Attendance**

We would like to remind all parents/carers that it is a requirement by law, to ensure that your child is on time and at school each day the school is open and to provide a satisfactory explanation of any absence. Continued non-compliance with the Education Act (1990) is monitored by the Home School Liaison Officer for further investigation to help resolve the matter.

The following table is an extract rom the YCS Attendance Procedures document.

Parents/Caregivers	<ul> <li>Ensure children attend school regularly and are on time</li> <li>Notify the school in advance where possible of any absence</li> <li>Explain any absences as soon as possible but no later than seven (7) days from the first day of absence, through methods such as phone call,</li> </ul>
	Sentral, note or email  Provide a medical certificate for illness. This is mandatory for any Stage 5 and 6 assessment task that may be missed
	<ul> <li>Complete an 'Application for Extended Leave' for travel or a holiday and provide travel documentation</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Complete an 'Application for Exemption' as needed</li> <li>Work with the school to support any attendance concerns</li> </ul>

The school is required to follow up all unexplained absences (where a child has been absent, and no explanation has been received) within two days. A change in YCS processes will see this be done by sending a letter home to parents with students. It would be greatly appreciated if parents could sign this explanation and return it to school as soon as possible.

Whilst attendance at school is important there are times when students are not well enough to attend. There are a number of illnesses circulating the community at the moment.

If your child gets sick or injured at school, the school will contact you. If your child is ill, they will go to an area where they can lie down and be monitored. You will be called to come and collect your child if they are too sick to go back to the classroom. For this reason, it is important to keep your contact details up to date with the school, including an alternative contact – such as a relative or neighbour – who the school can call if you are unavailable.

### If your child is sick at home

From time to time your child may get sick. If they display any of the following symptoms, they should stay at home and see a doctor:

- a fever of 38°C or above
- vomiting or diarrhoea
- cough or respiratory symptoms
- cold or flu symptoms
- · rashes of an unknown origin.

Students who are not hungry and are well hydrated perform better in the classroom, show increased concentration, and are less likely to be irritable and disruptive.
