QUESTACON 2024





Yeoval Central School, combined with Peak Hill Central School, was fortunate enough to be the recipient of a hands-on Questacon Innovation Workshop on Friday.

A NSW government initiative funded the Questacon tour across the

region, which focused on developing student innovation in the workshops.

The workshop allowed students to learn about the experimental design process. Students utilised 'MakeyMakey' kits to learn about electric circuits, developing their confidence in the engaging and interactive STEM learning environment.

Students rotated between the Questacon workshops with a lesson ran by Mr Grubb from Peak Hill. In this workshop students designed and fired a paper rocket using compressed air. The champion rocket that reached a distance of over 40 metres was built by a Years 7/8 group. The welcomed wet weather meant that the rockets could only be fired once or twice before they

exploded. Yeoval and Peak Hill students were excited to have a visit from Member for Calare Mr Andrew Gee during the day. He visited students in both the Questacon Innovation Workshop and when the students were firing their paper rockets.

FYI EXHIBITION YEARS 7/8 FUTURE YEOVAL INNOVATORS





During Term 1, Years 7/8 FYI students have been working hard to answer the driving question "How can our footprint have a positive impact on today and tomorrow in our local and global environment?" Students have completed some excellent research and created some fabulous end products.

The Term 1 FYI Exhibition held on Tuesday was an opportunity to share our students' new knowledge and wonderful pieces of work. They delivered an energy presentation with a great deal of research into sustainable energy sources such as wind, water and solar. Their Easter Island Moai statues were on display and visitors had the chance to do their own artistic representations of them.

Years 7/8 students also shared Worlds, Minecraft their describing how they made them sustainable, also giving visitors the opportunity to contribute to their Worlds. The exhibition's Reading Corner was popular, with copies of students' graphic novels on display and available for reading on comfy cushions. The ocean pollutants posters were also on display and enjoyed students sharing interesting facts on the effects of pollution, and more importantly what we can all do to reduce the risk of damage as a result of polluting our oceans.

Before visitors left, they were given the opportunity to leave a message on how they can leave a positive footprint for the future and also to provide feedback so FYI students can attempt to make their exhibitions bigger and better next time.















THE FACTS ABOUT VAPING

Electronic cigarettes or e-cigarettes, often called 'vapes', are electronic devices designed to deliver vapourised liquids into the lungs. There are many different styles of vapes available and they can be difficult to spot.

The main ingredient in vapes is propylene glycol, vegetable glycerine or glycerol, and they often also contain nicotine, flavours and other chemicals. Vapes may contain harmful chemicals that aren't listed on the pack.

The biggest misunderstanding about vapes is that they are harmless compared to cigarettes. This is not true. *Vapes are not safe.*




Many vapes contain nicotine making them very addictive
