

## School Uniform Procedures – October 2019

Yeoval Central School and the P&C support the wearing of a school uniform that builds school culture and allows all students to be on a level playing field. There is no differentiation of class. The school uniform allows students to be in a safe environment, and is cost-effective, simple and easy-to-wear.

Yeoval Central School ensures we meet all [NSW DoE Policy guidelines](#), [Footwear Guidelines](#) and [Sun Safety](#) expectations.

The YCS school uniform is affordable, accessible and available. The full correct uniform is:

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ *Dark navy/gold polo with emblem in gold</li> <li>✓ *Dark navy fleecy jumper or hoody with emblem in gold</li> <li>✓ *Dark navy school hat (bucket style) with emblem in gold</li> <li>✓ *Dark navy anorak with gold trim and emblem in gold</li> <li>✓ *Dark navy beanie with emblem in gold</li> <li>✓ Dark navy bottoms (shorts, pants, track pants, skirt or skort)</li> <li>✓ Black socks or black stockings</li> <li>✓ Black enclosed shoe, leather is recommended</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Years 11 and 12 may wear an approved 'Senior Jersey'</li> <li>✓ Specialist areas – must wear black enclosed leather shoes</li> <li>✓ Long sleeve/skivvy top underneath polo (black)</li> <li>✓ Non-black joggers may be brought to wear during sport periods</li> <li>✓ A *blazer, white shirt, dark navy bottoms will be provided when representing the school. Parents may wish to purchase these items as well.</li> </ul>
<p>* Items to be purchased through the preferred supplier, details are on our school website. Other items can be purchased from any retailer of your choice. The P&amp;C coordinates the selling of used items of uniform.</p>	

The wearing of full correct uniform is expected of all students at all times. This includes during school hours, while travelling to and from school, and when engaged in school activities out of school hours.

Students are required to wear enclosed shoes. Wearing of leather shoes is a mandatory requirement for Workplace Health and Safety reasons, particularly in the secondary school, where students are involved in more hazardous activities such as Science, Food Technology, Agriculture and Technology.

Yeoval Central School adopts the 'NO HAT NO PLAY' policy during Terms 1 and 4. Students are required to wear the school hat when in the sun, and are advised to wear it on all days where the UV Index level is 3 and above. If students do not have a hat, they can play under the Primary COLA or Bus Bay as per our YCS Playground Procedures.



If difficulties arise in purchasing the full correct uniform, parents should contact the school. Students must present a note from their parent if they will be out of uniform on a particular day that states the reason for the breach of the School Uniform Procedures.

Responsibility:	Support for students wearing the correct school uniform:
Parent/Caregiver	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Supply correct school uniform, ensuring it is clean and in good condition</li><li>2. Label all items of uniform</li><li>3. Request support through the Student Assistance Scheme to purchase uniform</li><li>4. Let the school know if child will be out of uniform on a particular day</li></ol>
Student	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>5. Cooperate by wearing correct school uniform with pride</li><li>6. Be responsible for my belongings</li></ol>
Year Advisor	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>7. Check uniform and record on Sentral each morning</li><li>8. Follow YCS Behaviour Management Procedures</li><li>9. Recognise students in correct uniform</li><li>10. Contact parent/caregiver if student is not wearing correct uniform</li></ol>
Teachers	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>11. Throughout the day, monitor students in uniform and follow YCS Behaviour Management Procedures</li><li>12. Record on Sentral any breach to the policy</li></ol>
Executive	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>13. Confiscate any items of clothing that do not comply and are unnecessary during the course of the day</li><li>14. Work with parents/caregivers and students to support these procedures</li></ol>
